Welcome to the Summer Term in Year 2!

Our Curriculum: (Curriculum Overviews can be accessed on the school website)

Mathematics: We are continuing to develop our skills in addition and subtraction, learning different strategies to work out problems. We will focus on 2, 5 and 10 multiplication tables and increase our understanding of division. We will be applying our addition, subtraction, multiplication and division skills to problem-solving. We will also revisit measure, money, shape and statistics as part of our revision and to further develop our skills.

English: In English we are continuing to improve our understanding of comprehension and grammar using our focus text 'The Owl who was afraid of the Dark'. We will develop our spelling, and use suffixes such as -ly, -ment, -ness, -less, correctly. We will be reading and writing a variety of genres, making sure we use adverbs and adjectives in our writing. We will develop our writing skills, ensuring that our handwriting is neat with tall letters tall and tail letters going under the line. Our letters must be correctly formed with some diagonal strokes, ready to join our letters.

Religious Education: We will learn and discuss Ascension and Pentecost and what this means to Christians. Then we will also focus on why Church is a special place for Christians and discuss other special places and beliefs.

Science: As part of our Animal Detectives Theme, we will learn about Animals including Humans. The children will learn about life cycles and habitats. We will discuss the importance of eating healthily and having an active, healthy lifestyle.

Design & Technology: The children will learn about nutrition and they will design and make a healthy dish.

Topic (History and Geography): In history we will be learning about famous people, including Florence Nightingale and Mary Seacole. In our geography topic we will be learning about Kenya and comparing it to our own locality. We will look at change, differences and similarities.

Music: In music we will be learning to play the recorder.

Physical Education: Year 2 will develop their basic skills in PE and learn and play receiving games.

Art and Design: We will explore African art and the Artist Pavitra Eshwar. The children will design some artwork in this stule.

PSHE: In PSHE we will be discussing the different groups that we belong to and the importance of valuing and respecting our differences.

Home Learning: All home learning is now set via Purple Mash. Please make sure that your child checks 2email in Purple Mash for information about home learning.

Spellings: Children will be given a spelling list every Monday and will be tested the following Monday.

Reading: In order to be competent readers, children need to read regularly at home and school. Parents/Carers are asked to encourage their children to read regularly and to read for pleasure.

We ask parents/carers to sign and date reading records every time you hear your child read (we expect a minimum of **three** entries/comments a week). This is an ideal opportunity to question your child on their understanding of the text, to improve their comprehension skills and vocabulary. Reading records must be brought into school on your child's allocated day, for teachers to monitor.

All children will have the opportunity to read a variety of high-quality texts in class, including 'Reading for Pleasure' books, and 'Related Reads', which are linked to their focus theme

Maths: Children in Year 1 to 6 have got access to TT Rockstars, a maths programme focusing on multiplication tables link Please encourage your child to this online programme on a regular basis. Additional Information:

Playground Equipment and Games: Children are not allowed to use any of the playground equipment or bring in balls to play with before or after school. Also, children are not permitted to use bikes or scooters on the school grounds. This is for health and safety reasons. Children must not enter the school car park or climb on the blue railings.

PE Uniform: PE lessons will take place on Monday. Swimming lessons will take place on **Friday**. Children will be expected to attend school in PE uniform on their PE day. This consists of a sky-blue T-shirt, school jumper, cardigan or hoody, and navy/black shorts, or navy/back leggings, or navy/black joggers, and a pair of dark-coloured trainers (no bright colours please). Children are also encouraged to bring a rainproof jacket for outdoor use in inclement weather.

Handwriting Pens (KS2): Teachers will issue a 'Pen License' if and when your child is ready to make the transition from pencil to pen.

Parking: Please be reminded that parking on the school premises is for permit-holders only between 7am and 4.30pm.

Attendance and Punctualitu: Good attendance is crucial in your child's education. If your child is unwell and unable to attend school, please notify the office staff.

School Uniform: Please ensure that children wear the correct school uniform and look smart. This includes black shoes. We strongly encourage you to have your child's name clearly marked or labelled in all items of clothing. Please ensure that your child comes to school with a coat. We encourage hair accessories, such as hair bands and bobbles, to be consistent with the colour of the uniform e.g., sky blue, navy, grey or black. Long hair should be tied back.

Earrings: Children are not permitted to wear earrings in school. This is for health and safety reasons.

Water bottles: Children are encouraged to drink water during the school day to keep them hydrated. They may bring in a plastic water bottle (preferably clear) with their name labelled on it. They should take it home regularly to be washed. Children can refill bottles in school

Sun care: As the weather begins to improve, please could you provide your child with a sunhat, which is clearly labelled with their name, and ensure that they have had sunscreen applied before school.

Snacks: Children may bring in a snack of either toast or a piece of fruit for morning playtime. Other items such as cakes, biscuits, crackers, sweets, cereal or fruit bars are not permitted at playtime. Please be aware that there are children in school with nut allergies. Therefore, can you please ensure that your child does not bring any items containing nuts into school as part of their packed lunch or snack. Please note that this may include some cereal bars.

Birthday Celebrations: We will continue to invite children to wear nonuniform on the last Friday of the month of their birthday. Children will not be required to bring in a party snack.

Medication: If your child requires medication such as inhalers, please ensure that you child's class teacher is provided with medication that is within its expiry date and is clearly labelled. You will be required to complete a medical form from the school office.

Pets: Dogs are not permitted on the school grounds. Please do not tie dogs up near greas where children will walk.
