



Beyond Living Memory: The Great Fire of London Year 1 Knowledge Mat

Pudding Lane	A street in London where the fire started,
Leather Bucket	A bucket made from leather, which was used to put the fire out.
Water Squirter	Firefighters used water squirters to battle the fire.
Diary	A book that a person can write in. They write about events and experiences in their life.
St Paul's Cathedral	A famous religious building in London that was destroyed by the fire.
Firefighters	People who are trained to put out fires/

- The fire happened between the 2nd and 5th of September 1666.
- In the olden days houses were made of wood and straw. They were also built very close together which made the fire spread quickly.
- The fire also spread quickly because of the strong winds.
- Samuel Pepys buried cheese, wine and books in his garden when the fire started.
- The fire lasted for 4 days and it destroyed more than 13,000 homes.
